Background:

MESAA is the abbreviation of Medi Educational Support Association for Afghanistan.


It is one of charity, non-beneficial, non-governmental and non-political association. MESAA was established to participate in the rehabilitation of Afghanistan. Its main objective is to provide essential assistance to those school children and education workers who has difficulty in commuting due to their physical inabilities

MESAA was established in 2002 and after completion of first year wheelchair project under umbrella of Japan International Friendship and Welfare Foundation (JIFF), MESAA got official registered in Ministry of Planning of Islamic Transitional Government of Afghanistan in 2003, this gave MESAA the ability and chance for implementing of its projects needed and to participate in the rehabilitation of war torn Afghanistan.

Implemented Projects:

Since its establishment MESAA had implemented the below mentioned projects:

2003- Distribution of 100 wheelchairs through JIFF.





2004- Program for relief of educational materials for poor students.

Seventy really poor students received materials such as school bag, cloths, stationary, shoes etc which was enough for one year.

2004- Distribution of 100 wheelchairs.



2005 Program of Wheelchair/tricycle Follow up done for about 100 wheelchairs.



2006- Distribution of 70 new wheelchairs and repairing of 13 Wheelchairs/tricycle.



2007- Inspection of 70 wheelchairs/tricycles and repairing of 7 wheelchairs/tricycle.



2008- Inspection of 65 wheelchairs/tricycle and repairing of 7 of them.



2009- Distribution of **24** new wheelchairs; Inspection of 100 wheelchairs/tricycles which 21 out of them have been repaired.



2010- Distribution of 15 new wheelchair; Inspection of 65 wheelchairs/tricycles which 23 out of the have been repaired.

First experimental locally production of 4 Tricycles.





2011- Distribution 21 new wheelchairs; Inspection of 50 wheelchairs/tricycles which 13 out of them have been repaired.



2012- Distribution of 11 new wheelchairs; Inspection 47 wheelchairs/tricycles which 10 out of them have been repaired.



2013-Distribution of 12 new wheelchair and Inspection of 30 wheelchairs and tricycle which 11 wheelchairs and tricycle were repaired.





2014-Distribution of new wheelchair and Inspection of 37 wheelchairs and tricycle which 12 out of which repaired.

2015-Distribution of 5 new wheelchairs and inspection of 45 wheelchairs and tricycle which 17 out of which repaired.



Activity Report for the year 2016:

Introduction: Because of our limited fund for this year we tried our best to make a maximum use of our available budget. Therefore we decided to concentrate more on the inspection and repairing in the first half of the year and few new tricycles to be distributed. We will use the remaining fund for purchasing new tricycles in Dec 2016. Based on this, we already inspected 37 and repaired 9 tricycles and wheelchair until the end of September and distributed 5 new wheelchairs for the very needy clients. We are planning to inspect at least 20 wheelchairs and tricycles and repair 4 to 6 of them by the end of this financial year. Then in last month of FY we are planning to use the remaining fund to buy new wheelchair and distribute them already screen end user. We will forward our last and final report in the first month of new FY.




Comments from receiver: Thanks for donated this to me. With this 1 could finish my school and post graduated education; and started my own business as a 100% normal man.








Wheelchair Maintenance and Distribution Project for Afghanistan

MESAA 2016

Summary 2016:

We started implementation of project as soon as school started. Screening for new receivers and following up for broken wheelchairs and tricycles started as soon as we heard about funding for 2016.

With this year financial and technical support from Collaborative Music Workshop (CMW) we were able to distribute and repair affirmation number of wheelchairs and tricycles until Sep 2016. Repairing section is ongoing and we really hope to provide repairing service to 8-10 users till end of this FY; and could buy and distribute more wheelchairs if funding allows us. The direct beneficiaries (receivers/user) and indirect beneficiaries (family member and teachers) are very happy, appreciative for all in touch and asked for extension and expansion of the project.





- 1. Due to fall of Afghan currency rate and ability to find a vendor to provide wheelchair with cheap price to us we were able to increase the number of new wheelchair for distribution as you can see the details above.
- **2.** We the MESAA staff has been trying hard to make the best use of our limited financial assistance we have been receiving in recent years, even with minimum payments.
- 3. Continuation of this project added one more year experience to MESAA background and keep MESAA going to help disadvantage people. We have experienced that a user has been using a tricycle for 14 year because of facilitating repairing service.
- 4. The project is always well received by all direct and indirect beneficiaries.

5. MESAA staff is grateful to MCJ and MCW as well as all individual for providing us with a chance to be in the service of our needy people through your kind cooperation and support.

Remark: As you are well aware during this year the number of displaced Afghans has increased rapidly due to fierce fighting in the country as well as a big rush of returning refugees from neighboring countries.
